

Best practices for local-level social engagement and guideline implementation in the blue economy sector

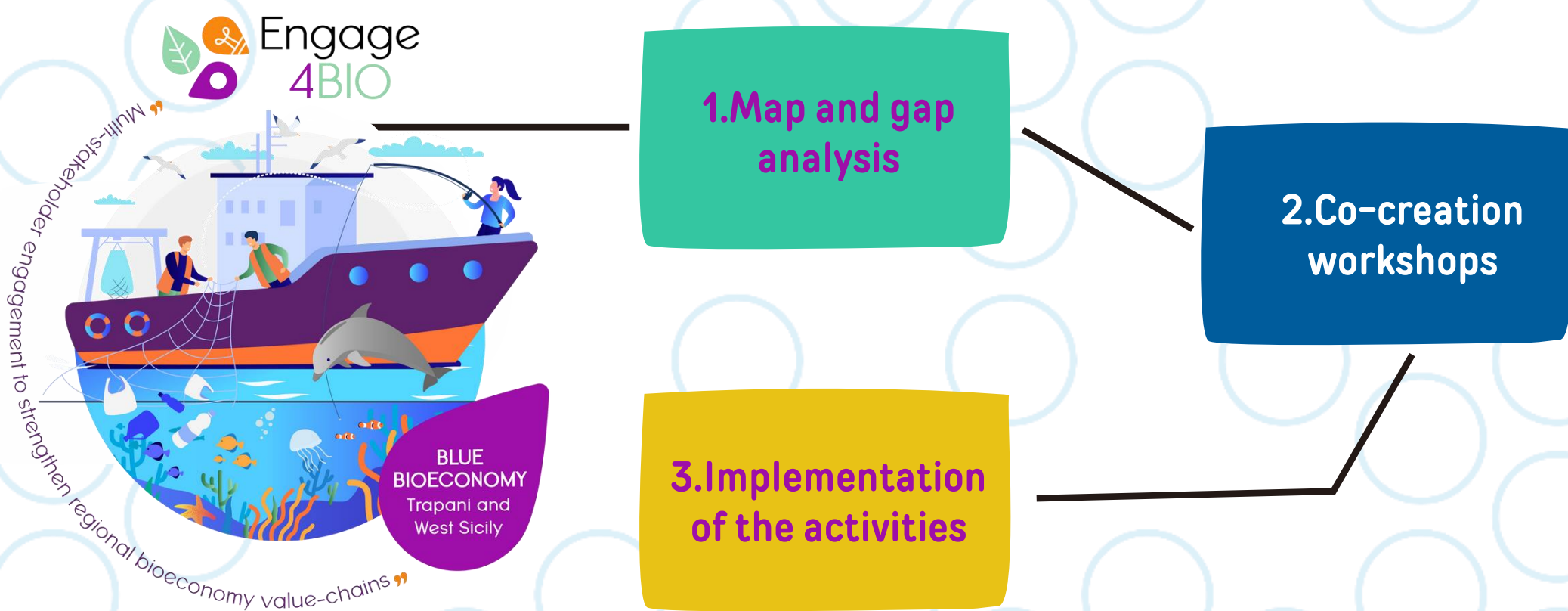
